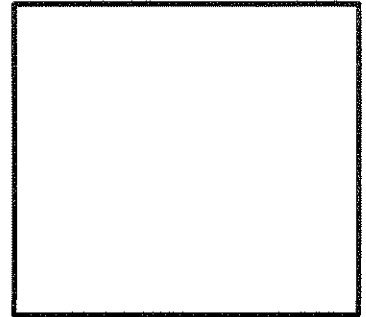

Please capture your (thumb) fingerprint and examine which Characteristics are present in your print. Circle which ones apply to you.



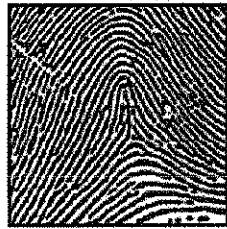

Arches

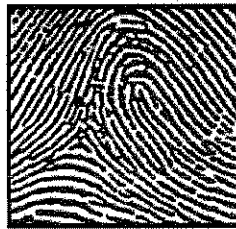


Plain Arch

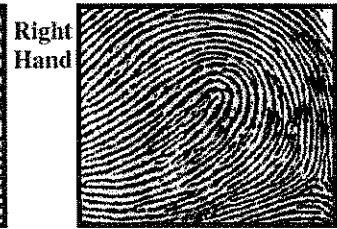


Tented Arch

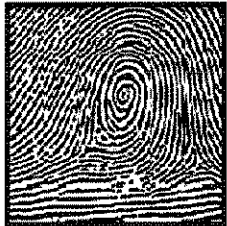

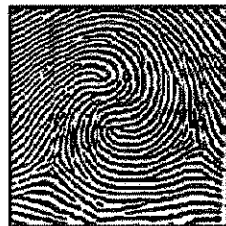

Methods: Contour: outline of a subject.
Cross contour: lines wrapped around object to show volume.
Gesture: many rapidly drawn lines. Used to capture position and movement.
Hatch/Cross hatch: closely drawn lines. Used to create value.
